REFERENCE: HNP. 916. BARBIER, Emile Flavien.

Taken by the German Military to the Jersey Prison on the 5th. November, 1942.

Sentenced to (3) three years imprisonment.

Removed from the Jersey Prison and sent to France on the 22nd. January, 1943, was then aged 33 years, height 5 feet 7 inches.

Four other men were removed at the same time - (3) three Frenchmen and (1) one Belgian national - all with Barbier being political prisoners.

The above information is from a record book kept at H.M.Prison in Jersey. The names of all the prisoners are recorded but not their addresses. Therefore it has not been possible to contact any of the other four ex-prisoners, that is if they are still living.

I understand that my brother went from one prison to another in France, then was eventually transferred in turn to (2) two Concentration Camps; one being Rollwald/Darmstadt, and subsequently released by the American Army, he then became attached to an American Unit as an Interpreter - the address being:-

U.N.R.R.A.

As my brother is temporarily, we hope, in a mental hospital at St. Saviour, Jersey, C.I. and his condition mainly due to his wartime experiences, it has been considered unwise to question him too much as to the correct name and address of the concentration camp from which he was released, but no doubt the American Intelligence Services would have records of his release and his employment.

When found, he was unable to stand without aid, this being due to weakness induced by illness, malnutrition and ill-treatment. It is known that he was repeatedly beaten by the guards, knocked down an iron staircase and all-together badly ill-treated.

For the reason already stated, my brother is unable to make an application on his own behalf. I, therefore, as his curator, duly authorised by the Royal Court of the States of Jersey, do make the application; even though he has a wife living, it is my duty to do so on behalf of both as authorised by law.] X

I understand that, authentication of my brother's sentence by the Germans and the other relevant matters ~~appertaining~~ appertaining to his incarceration can be established on application to the Bailiff's Chambers at the Royal Court in Jersey, where, I further understand your department has already made enquiries regarding other applications.

The following information was given by the patients brother Mr. Marcel Barbier.

Parents dead Father in 1936 from the effects of gas
 Mother 5 years ago.

Siblings Marcel 55
 Emile (patient) 53
 Flavien died early in childhood from accident
 Charles died last year aged 49 Carcinoma of the throat
 Noella 46 unmarried in a family home.


Patient was devoted to his mother, and said to be her "blue eyed boy" When she died, patient collapsed with a breakdown and was treated by Dr. O'Connor and had a male nurse and a housekeeper. Recently he sacked the male nurse, believed he was in a concentration camp and the nurse was a male guard.

Patient was deported during the Occupation, was in several French prisons and concentration camps, was a leader. Was released and went to London with brother. Had severe nightmares and had to be wakened from these. Returned to Jersey, had shop and street photography business. Went to Hotel Les Arches 1950, was landlord-tenant. Sold the business and retired 2 years ago, had no hobbies, had enough money; last year spent his time in public houses.

In November 1961 he went to help brother who is a wholesale supplier to ladies hairdressers, was in this 3 months and settled well, then started drinking gin and beer, was unsteady and confused and had memory loss, was arriving late for work and drinking in the mornings.

Last year was employed by Jersey Airlines as a courier, started drinking with parties.

Early History Attended the "Beeches", average scholar, no interest in physical activities. On leaving school went into the hotel trade in Jersey and then French Hotels, restaurant in Paris. Had the Corner House Restaurant and Hotel when the war started. When he returned to Jersey after the war the place was destroyed.




Informant says patient has always loved animals, is hypersensitive, extremely fond of children. His dog died last year and he was continually upset for 2 weeks afterwards.

Patient had the DTs 5 years ago, and this breakdown was said to be rather severe, and it was at this time he had the male nurse in attendance.

He was one who loved to be in on any excitement from an early age. During the Occupation, when a group of English people were being deported, patient was with a group of College boys who demonstrated, and he was the eldest of the group; he was picked out and deported; when at last the camp was liberated by the Americans he was made commandant of the camp which was of mixed nationalities. He only recently started talking about the horrors of his experiences while in prison camps, and only then did his wife learn of his illnesses which were:-

Sinus operation to base of Spine
Operation for Hernia
Diphtheria + another illness
Lapses of memory

Also had an operation for repair of Hernia January 1957 in Jersey.
