

With reference to your letter dated 4th November 1964, please be advised that the following information is contained in our records:

FOX, Georges, born 22 May 1896 in St. Helier, Jersey, Occupation: cabinet-maker, Nationality: British or French, - was in the "Strafanstalt Frankfurt/Main-Preungesheim" in the year 1943 (exact date unknown). Document 1362/43 issued by the "Strafanstalt Frankfurt/Main-Preungesheim". He died in Naumburg/Saale on 11 March 1945 and was buried in Naumburg/Saale.

Documents consulted: Nominal list established by the "Oberstaatsanwalt Frankfurt/Main"; "Liste des Evang. Pfarramtes St. Wenzel in Naumburg/Saale".

NAUMBURG-ON-SAALE. GERMANY. FROM AUGUST 1944
UNTILL HE DIED ON MARCH 11TH 1945.
HE SUFFERED THE SAME PRIVATIONS AS "THE LATE
CANON COHU, CLIFFORD QUERE, JOSEPH TIERNEY
(OF JERSEY) E. LEQQ. CECIL DUQUEMIN,
AND FRANK W. FALLA (OF GUERNSEY).

ALL SUFFERED
THE SAME HARDSHIPS & ILL-TREATMENT.

THE DETAILS
OF HIS ILL-TREATMENT AND DEATH WERE TOLD
BY FRANK-W. FALLA. OF GUERNSEY. NO DEATH
CERTIFICATE WAS OBTAINED.

MARCH - APRIL 1943. THE GERMAN MILITARY POLICE
ARRESTED MR FOX. THE REASON FOR THIS WAS THAT HE REMOVED
FOOD "TO FEED HIS FAMILY" FROM GERMAN BARRACKS.
AND PLACED HIM IN PRISON IN JERSEY FOR A FEW MONTHS.
HE WAS THEN SENT TO FRANCE. FROM FRANCE TO HAMBURGSTR. 112
FRANKFURT GERMANY. AND FROM THERE TO NAUMBURG-ON-SAALE
WHERE HE DIED OF STARVATION.
