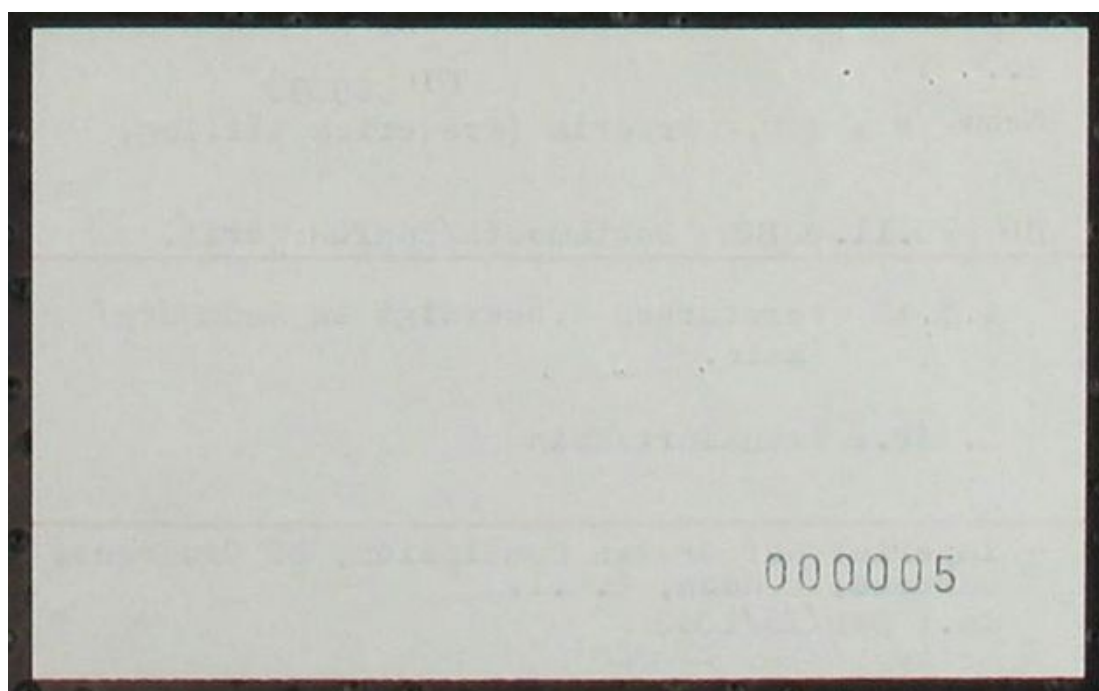

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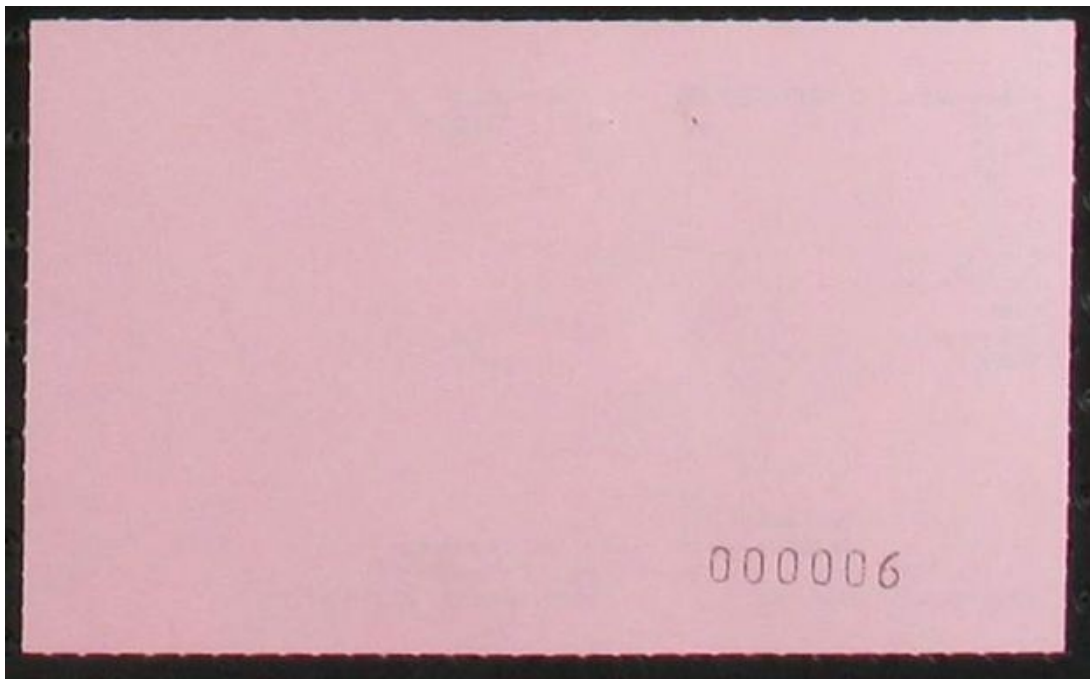

FEW SURVIVORS OF TERRIBLE ORDEAL

THE FOLLOWING GRAPHIC ACCOUNT OF THE EXPERIENCES OF A DOZEN OR SO CHANNEL ISLANDERS IN A GERMAN PRISON CAMP IS WRITTEN BY MR. FRANK W. FALLA, FORMERLY EDITOR OF THE GUERNSEY "STAR" AND LATTERLY ASST. EDITOR OF THE "EVENING PRESS" OF THAT ISLAND. MR. FALLA WAS HIMSELF A POLITICAL PRISONER AND A THOROUGH TATIVE DETAILS ARE GIVEN CONCERNING THE FATE OF A NUMBER OF JERSEY FOLK.

I left Guernsey on the night of June 23d, 1944, and with three colleagues—Lagg, Goussier and Dupont—plus a fledgling group of four men, was transported across France and Germany (in six or seven days) to Frankfurt-on-Main. When we arrived there we were shipped off our drab coats and made to don convict regalia like the two other prisoners. Within a few days, despite the extreme watchfulness of the Nazi guards and wardens, I contacted several Jerseymen who were in prison with me. When marching around ring of the yards (strictly restricted—15 minutes per day, rain or shine), if we could not slay whorper a few words to each other we exchanged V-or-thunder-signals. I had been at Frankfurt barely a month when the Germans decided they would send all but three of the "Englishers" to Neumunster Prison, right in the heart of Germany. In initial we raised all-armed from our yards and led a little Channel Island "parade." So that we were transported to Neumunster (222 prisoners) and quarantined with other criminal nationals (Poles, Czechs, Slavs, Danes, Belgians, French and Germans). By September, 1944, other Channel Islanders had joined us and there was a total of 11 of us in separate sections of the prison (my cousin, the extremely handsome Sir and Sir). The group was then made up of the following: Jerseymen: Joseph Dugard, Fred Page, Gus Fox, William Goussier, Clifford Quade, Joseph Tenny, Clifford Gohls, and Guernseyman: Cyril Dupont. Joseph Gillingham, Ernest Legg and myself (we went all in the same camp).

To put it mildly, we all had a very hard time of it at the hands of the Nazis and suffered much physically and especially mentally. We were confined to solitary cells (measuring 16 cubic metres), had little or no attention for our physical discomfort upon short rations and poor food (by December, 1944, we were reduced to 6 oz. of bread per day and a litre of soup, 20 per cent of which was water). Breakfast and dinner were contemptible as arranged as and the prison conditions was 16 men per week. We were not allowed hot drinks (not even drinking water, cigarettes, English books or letters to or from our loved ones in the Channel Islands). The latter was particularly troubling to our undeterred spirit... We were allowed to write four letters in a year but all were returned marked "No Quaterned return." So that I speculated that we were not to send a message and were in the hands of Guernsey and Jersey stating that we were all well and at Neumunster. This was easily refuted by the prison question despite repeated appeals. I could write a deal more of what we did suffer for our political "crime" (most of us were imprisoned for having retained our nation against Nazi policies) related to the "wrong" station, the B.B.C., and spread the word by underground news-sheet, but I know the paper shortage and lack of space are the main's major problems these days.

Though half past, the prospect of us did manage to survive the maximum treatment meted out to us by the Nazi prison authorities and guards, but the weakness of us (despite our clerical and typical English spirit) went to the wall and I regret having to state that in a period of eight months, at the 11 Channel Islands prisoners at Neumunster (September, 1944—May 1st, 1945) only six of us were alive to tell the tale. As each man died I requested my request to the Nazi prison governor that at least two of us be allowed to attend the final rites of our dead comrades. Each request met the unapologetically prompt answer: "No!" As each man died I was told that, externally, through the German and International Red Cross, next of kin would be informed. Since I returned from Germany I've found out that the six German men who were shipped with this, they say, were very close to knowing the dead. This has been painfully stressed to me by relatives of Channel Island prisoners who have begged from me some of their loved ones who were taken away by the Germans. Hence the short article as my answer is that the only way a man provide it out of a cheerful nature. However, being a, facts must be told, and to be being and the particulars of our journey and the tales of their deaths which I was at Neumunster, Santa Maria.

Joseph Pigeot — September, 1944; Frederick Fox, January 23d, 1945. (He was one of us captured on grounds of ill-health, but died a week before the order came through. He had done very little work and had been ailing for a year.) George Fox (aged 28, March 11th, 1945; William Marsh died at Ulm (near Zurich), aged 24, on March 2nd, 1945; Clifford Quade, May 1st, 1945. (The latter was released with Guernseyman Legg and turned by the Americans on April 14th, not long at the State Hospital in England after serving two years' imprisonment.) With the exception of young William Marsh, all the above died at Neumunster Prison. An ex-G.I. officer and Guernsey resident, Frederick Miller, died at Frankfurt-on-Main at the end of August, 1944, a month before he was due for release.

Of the other Jerseymen, I met James Clifford Cole (husband of Mrs. Cole, Holly Lodge, Five Dukes) who left Neumunster Prison in September, 1944, gravely ill (he had not to be hospitalized on grounds of ill-health) for transfer to a Nazi work camp, a month before he was due to finish his sentence. Since it concerns only to the year-old Joseph Tenny, of St. Saviour's who was discharged on March 25th, having completed his two-year sentence. I could not know when he was well enough I would deem it as probable that both the above were taken to internment camps within the area now occupied by the Germans.

I very much regret that this article can bring little cheer or comfort to Jersey people and can only illustrate the cruel and the bad-enough that we Channel Island political prisoners suffered at the hands of a vile enemy. Condemned by the Nazis we had much, but our captives were worse—we were not allowed to write, talk, sing, read or smoke. It was a daily effort, but as we there were no words, no music, no food, no light, no heat and the exact truth, but our day our future would be conquered. But we would be free. One of our original party were fortunate enough to receive a parole ticket, comprised of letters with cover or framed from our friends and still there, as a end of our days. Even as a Christmas present we can never, better or for, with us suffered at the hands of Hitler, Nazis, Germans, and the cowardly but not unscrupulous Gestapo, to posterity.

FARMERS DISCUSS WHAT IS POSITION OF AND TOMATO CRO

QUESTIONS ON MANY OTHER SUBJECTS

A REPRESENTATIVE MEETING OF MEMBERS AND NON-MEMBERS OF THE JERSEY FARMERS' UNION WAS HELD ON SATURDAY, JULY 2nd, AT THE TOWN HALL WHEN SEVERAL QUESTIONS OF IMPORTANCE TO THE AGRICULTURAL COMMUNITY WERE CONSIDERED.

THE EARLY POTATO CROP

The chair was taken by Mr. P. Le Feuvre (Jury Farm, St. Mary), President of the Union, at his side being Messrs. C. P. Journeaux and T. G. Le Marchand (Vineyard Farm), and Edgar Talbot (Secretary).

Mr. Le Feuvre explained that the main reason for calling the farmers together was to consider the uncertainty of being able to export the 1945 crop due to the French note of the Colorado Potato, but especially in reference to the early potato crop. If they intended growing cabbages next year they had to begin planting now in order that they might be able to put some aside.

In view of the uncertainty now existing in growing cabbages, the Jersey Farmers' Union decided to approach the departments of the State—the Agriculture Department and the Department of Finance and Economics—in order to see what was going to be their policy in respect of agriculture in 1945. They were told that, as the State were bankrupt, they could give no pledge, neither could they commit the State to any particular policy in 1945. They, however, promised to send a deputation to meet the Ministers of Agriculture and Food in London this autumn, probably in the month of September, to find out exactly where they stood as far as our export trade to Britain was concerned.

In view of the possibility of the British Government placing an embargo on the export of potatoes from England they were going to raise the question of the possibility of sending potatoes to the R.I.A. or the Army of Occupation. In any case, the Government could give no certainty or guarantee as to what would happen, or whether we would be able to export at all next year. The position was therefore very uncertain. The Union felt they had a duty to perform towards the farmer, and that it was necessary to pass whatever information they received on to the farmers so that they would know where they stood. It, therefore, they were planning to plant potatoes next year they realized that they would be at their own risk. The position might, of course, be clarified by the autumn, but by then they would have incurred expenses. That, then, was the position in so far as the potatoes were concerned.

THIS YEAR'S CROP

Continuing Mr. Le Feuvre, speaking of this year's crop, said this was a time when favourable. Assuming they planned to grow potatoes next year, and got some, a reasonable quantity of seed. There should be no difficulty in getting rid of the surplus. When the Department of Agriculture was consulted on the matter, they agreed to recommend to the State that they guarantee the farmers 12-18 per cent up to August 31st and 14-18 per cent, his means would no longer understand the reason for difference. They also tried to get the two Departments to agree to the setting up of an organization for the marketing of this year's crop. This had not yet been decided, but he felt sure that, if they did not get marketing, and the thing was started, they would, at least, get better prices for the surplus of this year's crop. Other

questions had also been taken up but he felt this was the time to ask if anyone had questions to put. If the speaker would do his best to answer them.

QUESTIONS

In reply to a question Mr. Le Feuvre said the surplus of this year's crop was for local consumption. The Department of Agriculture had said of potatoes had agreed that when the situation went across they would try to make arrangements with the Ministry of Food to carry along potatoes to some later date. This meant that, as long as the local crop supplies were made, it would be agreed to a later date.

Mr. Le Marchand asked what would happen to potatoes bought before the point was fixed.

Mr. Le Feuvre said, it was the intention of the authorities to license all potato buyers and establish a Potato Marketing Board. In the meantime they could not prevent the sale of potatoes at prices determined by the market. That, of course, was a matter for the individual.

THE TOMATO CROP

The President said the position in so far as the tomato crop was concerned was relatively very much better. On June 14th representatives of the Jersey Farmers' Union and the Jersey Farmers' Union met with Mr. J. J. B. and Mr. Drake, of the Ministry of Food, and ascertained that the Ministry in England during the last few years had been to sell most of the imported tomato produce through central boards. Since 1942 there had been an organization dealing with the marketing of tomatoes. Mr. Drake said they would under what conditions they could market in England. It would, he said, be always be subject to the Ministry of Agriculture giving us permission to export. But before Mr. Drake left London the Ministry of Food decided that tomatoes could only be exported for

EXPORT TO ENGLAND ON CONDITION

that all restrictions which applied to English growers should apply to Jersey. This was known as the Jersey Produce Marketing Association. It was a big organization controlled by the Ministry of Food and operated all over Britain. After seeing that all the details of the scheme outlined by Mr. Drake, they felt that growers in Jersey would benefit substantially by participating in the scheme. The marketing prices were then proposed, and the speaker said—

From now to mid-August 11/- (12 lbs.) grower's price.
Mid-August to mid-September 10/- (12 lbs.) grower's price.
Mid-September to mid-October 11/- (12 lbs.) grower's price.
Mid-October to November 9/- (12 lbs.) grower's price.
November 12/- (12 lbs.) grower's price.



The Commission are endeavouring to identify a number of casualties who died whilst prisoners of war in German hands and they would be most grateful for your assistance in this matter.

I should explain that there are, in particular, four graves in Berlin 1939/45 War Cemetery bearing fairly comprehensive details of the occupants, and as it has not been possible to associate their particulars with any known British casualty it is believed that you may have record of such missing persons on your files for different missing Nationals.


Before concentration to Berlin 1939/45 War Cemetery in January 1949 these four casualties were buried in NAUMBERG Cemetery and from the limited evidence available it would seem that they died in the local civilian or military hospital.

The particulars of these four casualties were recorded by the Germans as follows:-

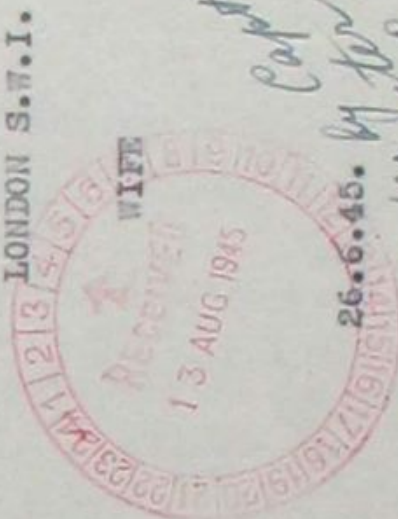



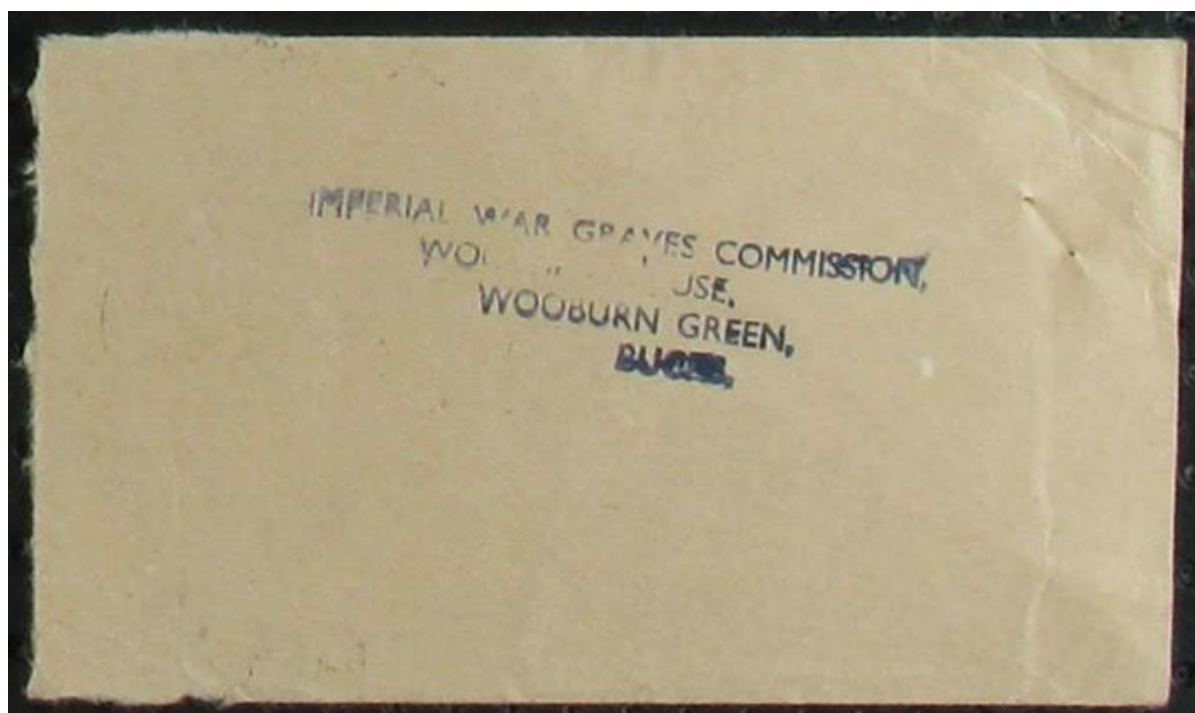

SUBJECT : Identification of casualties who died whilst prisoners of war in Germany.

Sir,

The following has been ascertained in connection with the four casualties in Naumburg/Saale, as referred to by you.

- (i) Frederick PAGE: According to a letter dated 5 January, 1945 from the "Strafgefangnis und Untersuchungshaftanstalt" in Naumburg/Saale, of which a copy is attached, Frederick Page was imprisoned as a convict in said prison from 3 July, 1944 until his death on 5 January, 1945. No indication is made to the effect that Page was a prisoner of war. We are also attaching copy of a death certificate concerning Frederick William Page, issued by the "Standesamt" in Naumburg/Saale.
- (ii) Emile PAISNEL-BOND or Emile PAISNEL: For this individual we hold neither documentation from Naumburg/Saale, nor registration of death.
- (iii) CLIFFORD QUERRE or CLIFFORD BOND QUERRE: For this case also we have no indications, or documentation from Naumburg/Saale.
- (iv) GEORGES FOX: For Fox Georges, aged 50, born in New Jersey, Locksmith, information is available from the "Ev. Pfarramt, St. Menzel" in Naumburg/Saale, stating that Fox died in Naumburg on 11 March, 1945 and was buried in the cemetery of the St. Menzel Parish, Naumburg.

Owing to the fact that former tracing enquiries for the persons referred to in (i) (ii) and (iv) give as last address: Frankfurt/Main, 112 Hamburgerstrasse, which is the address of a prison, it is possible that these individuals, as was the case with Page, were transferred from Frankfurt/Main to the Naumburg prison and died there. We believe that these casualties are also registered in Naumburg/Saale (Russian Zone of Germany) and would suggest your making application there.

It may interest you that we hold old tracing requests for Fox, made by his brother, Mr. E.K. Fox c/o Red Cross, Message Bureau, 201 Clarence House, St. James's, London S.W.1, dated 7 November, 1945, and for Paisnel-Bond, made by his son Mr. E.J. Paisnel-Bond, c/o Red Cross Message Bureau, as above.

After checking the documentary material at our disposal, we have been able to ascertain files of previous years for 15 persons.

However, for reasons of data protection, we can only give information about persons registered here to their direct relatives, respectively with their authorization, to third parties. Therefore we are not entitled to provide Mr Sanders, who has repeatedly inquired about the stage of our investigations by phone, with any information about these persons.
