

Joseph Tierney, born

15 AUG 1946

23rd of October 1912

Tierney (Channel islands)

Arrested by the Germans on March 3rd 1943
for spreading English news.

Sent to Nijmegen, France on September 18th 1943.

From there he went to Saarbrücken, then
Frankfurt on Main, then to a prison at
Kassel - Saale. From this prison he was
released on March 23rd 1945 his two years
being finished. He escaped from a

German transport train on April 23rd 1945.

A Frenchman (Rene Ventuzeton) wrote to
say that J. Tierney and some Belgians escaped
on the 23rd of April 1945, they became separated,

J. Tierney going towards the Russian zone and
the Frenchman towards France. The Frenchman

said that J. Tierney was recaptured with some
other three days after and was exhausted.

He said also, that J. Tierney was buried
in a communal grave on a railway embankment
near Chelone (Czech-Slovakia near Posen)

Now here are different news. A Belgian has

when they were recaptured on the 28th
of April 1945 and that J. Tierney died
on the night of May 4th at 11:10 P.M. 1945.
