

With reference to your letter dated 4th November 1964, please be advised that the following information is contained in our records:

PAGE, Frederik, William, born 20 November 1900 in Portsmouth, England, Nationality: British, - was in the "Strafanstalt Frankfurt/Main-Preungesheim" in the year 1943 (exact date unknown). Document 1367/43 issued by the "Strafanstalt Frankfurt/Main-Preungesheim" and Document 2 VLs 170/44 issued by the "Oberstaatsanwalt Frankfurt/Main". He died on 5 January 1945 and was buried in Naumburg/Saale.

Documents consulted: Nominal lists established by the "Oberstaatsanwalt Frankfurt/Main"; Nominal Roll of deceased PW's or DP's.

We are herewith enclosing the photocopy of an uncertified copy of a death certificate for the above named person, issued by the "Standesamt Naumburg/Saale".

The death certificate was sent to the Imperial War Graves Commission, Wooburn House, Wooburn Green, High Wycombe, Bucks., England on 29th July 1954.

I am directed by Mr. Secretary ~~Gordon Walker~~ to inform you that your application of ~~the 31st of September~~ 1964 to participate in the compensation payable under the terms of the Anglo-German Agreement dated the 9th June 1964 in respect of United Kingdom nationals who were victims of National Socialist measures of persecution, has been registered. ~~subject to medical examination where a claim for permanent disability has been made.~~

I am, however, to draw your attention to Paragraph 3 of the Notes for Guidance and to emphasise that no payment can be made until after the period for registration has ended on the 31st July 1965 and all claims have been received, when a further communication will be sent to you. Until then no action on your part is necessary except to keep this Department informed of any changes in your address.

I am also to return the Marriage Certificate, letters from the Bailiff of Jersey, ~~the~~ the Board of Trade, the Channel Islands Refugees Committee and four letters from the British Red Cross Society which you enclosed with your ~~the~~ application of the 31st of September, 1964.

Dear Mrs. Page,

It is with very deep regret that I write to tell you of the further information which we have now received from the Search Bureau in Germany concerning your husband.

The Bureau have sent us a Certificate dated January 8th 1945, from Naunburg(Saale) stating that Frederick William Page, born in Portsmouth on 20.11.1900, and living at Corisande, Tower Road, St. Helier, Jersey, Channel Islands, died at Naunburg(Saale) Roonplatz 5, on January 5th 1945 at 6.a.m. The cause of your husband's death is stated to have been heart failure and furunculosis.

An additional report obtained from Naunburg(Saale) by the Search Bureau states that, as you had told us, your husband had been sentenced to imprisonment by the German authorities for not delivering up a Wireless Set, and that

he had been imprisoned at Saarbrücken and at Frankfurt-Braunshausen, before being transferred to Naumburg on July 3rd 1944. It is also stated that the Welfare Office was requested to undertake his funeral.

I need not say how very, very sorry I am to have to send you this tragic news and I hope you will accept my very deepest sympathy in your overwhelming sorrow. If there is any way in which we could help you at any time please do not hesitate to let us know.

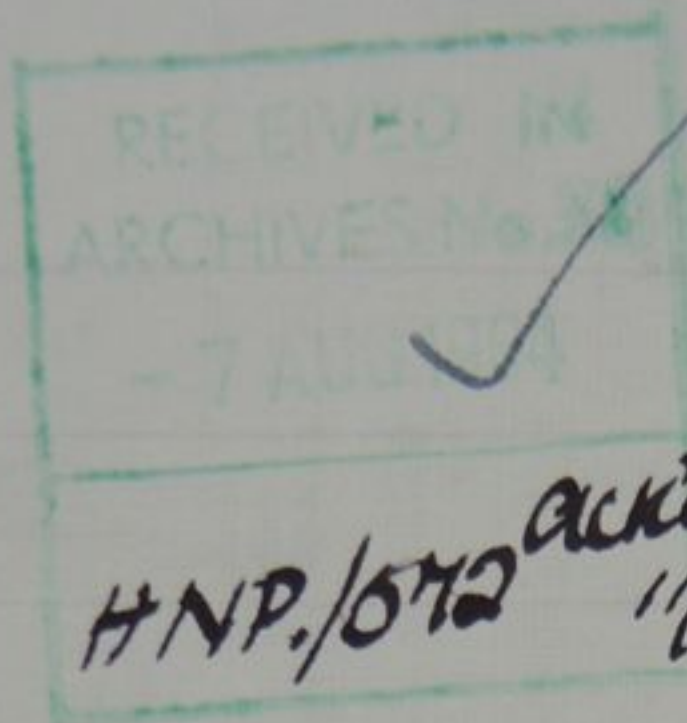
