

Held by Nazis, Seeks Father

A. J. Sauvey, whose address was formerly "General Delivery, Calgary," is being sought by his daughter, the former Alma Sauvey, now Madam Neeman, who was interned by the Nazis for almost two years.

In a letter to the Calgary branch of the Canada Red Cross, asking for assistance in locating her father, Madame Neeman states that she is "now liberated, but am without clothes, money or anything. All I had the Germans destroyed. . . . I want my father's aid."

Her papers have all been destroyed, and her birth certificate is in the Jersey Channel Isles which is still occupied by the Germans. "I want my father to get in touch with Somerset House as they most probably have the names of all British subjects. "I should very much like to be repatriated, but without proof of my nationality it would be impossible."

Madame Neeman wishes her father to get in touch with her through the British Consulate at Paris. Her address is given as "Madame Alma Neeman, c/o Madame Katz, No. 7 Rue de Maubeuge, Paris, 9 e."

Local Red Cross authorities also have several letters for Alfred Sorensen, and Mrs. Ida Sorensen, formerly of 102 Bleecker Street, Toronto, and the Palace Hotel, Calgary. The letters are from Denmark but so far it has been impossible to locate the addressees.
